Red Skelton:

Richard Bernard Skelton or "Red Skelton' was born in July 18, 1913. He was one of the great American entertainers and was known as a national television and radio comedian from 1937 to 1971. He was also the host of 'The Red Skelton Show' which was a long-running TV program. Skelton was known in the TV industry because of his presence in casinos, films, TV, nightclubs, and radio since he was a teenager. Along with his success, he also became known for wearing a colostomy bag, and that did not prevent from doing great things and performing well. He died Sept.17, 1997.





Dr. Susan Rosenthal, MD:

Dr. Susan Rosenthal was the founder of Crohns' and Colitis Foundation of America (CCFA). She had her ostomy when she was diagnosed with Crohn's disease. She died at the age of 78 years.

being purchased by the power company providing electricity to the little town of Nanaimo.

In 1907 that company proceeded to build the dam that formed Westwood Lake, the water pressure from which was used to operate a generating station far below on the Millstone River.



The power plant ceased operations in 1956 and in January 1957 the City of Nanaimo bought the land for \$1 and dedicated it as a city park.

Over the years, the park, with its 5.5 km walking trail around the lake, has become one of Nanaimo's best-loved parks.

FREE SAMPLES: Many manufacturers of ostomy appliances will send you a free trial of their products. Try e-mailing manufacturers and ask them if they have any programs for ostomates to try their products. Not every product available will work for every ostomate, which is why so many companies offer a sample. Get their address on Google by typing in company name. **SIMPLE TRICK:** To help the pouch flange stick better gently warm its sticky side – a low heat hair dryer for 30 secs is ideal for this. It helps make the glue super-tacky, and also makes firm flanges more pliable and mould-able to your personal skin.
